
Congregation Calls Susan Caufield as Pastor

Reverend Susan Caufield was called as the pastor of First Congregational Church of Barkhamsted by a vote of the congregation on November 12, 2023. The vote was unanimous. Reverend Caufield had been serving the church in the role of interim pastor since April 16, 2023 upon the retirement of Reverend Susan Wyman.

The meeting was held after the conclusion of the 10:00 am Sunday service. At the meeting, Sandy Davis, chair of the Search Committee, presented information on the pastoral search process and why the committee was recommending Susan Caufield to the congregation.

Several members of the congregation stood and voiced support for Susan. An enthusiastic vote concurred with this support and Susan was congratulated and welcomed as our newest pastor.

Sandy Davis, Chair of the Search Committee, said "from the first Sunday in April that Susan started serving as our Fill In Minister, feedback from members of the Search Committee and Church members was positive and optimistic. Some comments the Search Com-

mittee received were 'we wish Susan was our permanent pastor' and 'we enjoy Susan's sermons and style'. In my opinion, this was a great ending to an almost year-long search process for the Barkhamsted Congregational Church. We look forward to positive movement forward in our Church's future."

The Congregation welcomes Rev. Susan Caufield as our spiritual leader. The seamless transition from her interim role to the confirmed pastorship underscores the trust and admiration she has garnered within the community.

Operation Christmas Child - Shoebox Shopping

Each year our church participates in the Samaritan's Purse Operation Christmas Child, filling shoeboxes with gifts that are sent to needy children throughout the world.

The Deacons purchased 100 red and green shoeboxes and provided them to the congregation. This year 42 boxes were filled, with nine of those via an on-line process.

Rev. Susan Caufield blessed the shoeboxes and Kristi

Napolitano and her children delivered them to a local drop off point in New Hartford. A special shout out to friends of Beth Zils and Leslie Cosgrove from the Cambridge House in Granby who provided eight (8) shoeboxes with \$90 in donations and expressed enthusiasm to participate again next year.

Thanks to all who participated in this wonderful program. It seems that those filling the shoeboxes are almost as thrilled as those ultimately receiving them!

A Harvest of Seasonal Giving

The October 29th organ concert by our Organist Laurie Pont Hall resulted in a bountiful special offering.



Our church participates in the Heifer Project, allowing the purchase of many of God's creatures to help others provide for themselves: We were able to donate an Alpaca, a flock of chickens, and honey bees through this program.

The congregation filled 42 Samaritan Purse boxes to be sent to needy children in all corners of the world.

Thirteen winter coats (and a hat!) were donated to the FISH shelter in Torrington.

Bins and bins of non-perishable food for the area Food Pantry have been collected, and will continue to be gathered and delivered this winter, as the need continues to be great. Our donations go to the Pleasant Valley Food Bank serving New Hartford and Barkhamsted. Currently some of the things they are especially looking for are baking supplies, cold cereal, vinegar (any kind), cake mixes & frosting, juice, jelly, canned mixed fruit, canned pineapple, canned beets, canned peas & carrots, toothpaste (they don't need toothbrushes) deodorant and bar soap.

Many thanks to those who have donated, and those who have made sure all these gifts get to their destinations.
